# **Water Emergency Relief Project (WERP)**



**7,000** people across 10 communities received emergency drinking water supply and hygiene kits after the May 2024 flash floods.



Identified and prioritized **340** WASH activities with 340 communities across 20 provinces. 48 contracts has started physical work. 33,000+beneficiaries consulted, among them, 11,200 (34%) are women.



Proof of concept for solar-powered surface water irrigation component contracted with 7 companies. 14 agreements between PESCs and communities on service fees. Potentially mobilizing \$3 million co-investments. Provided capacity building for 70+ companies on financial and technical proposal preparation, including 3 fully women owned businesses.
